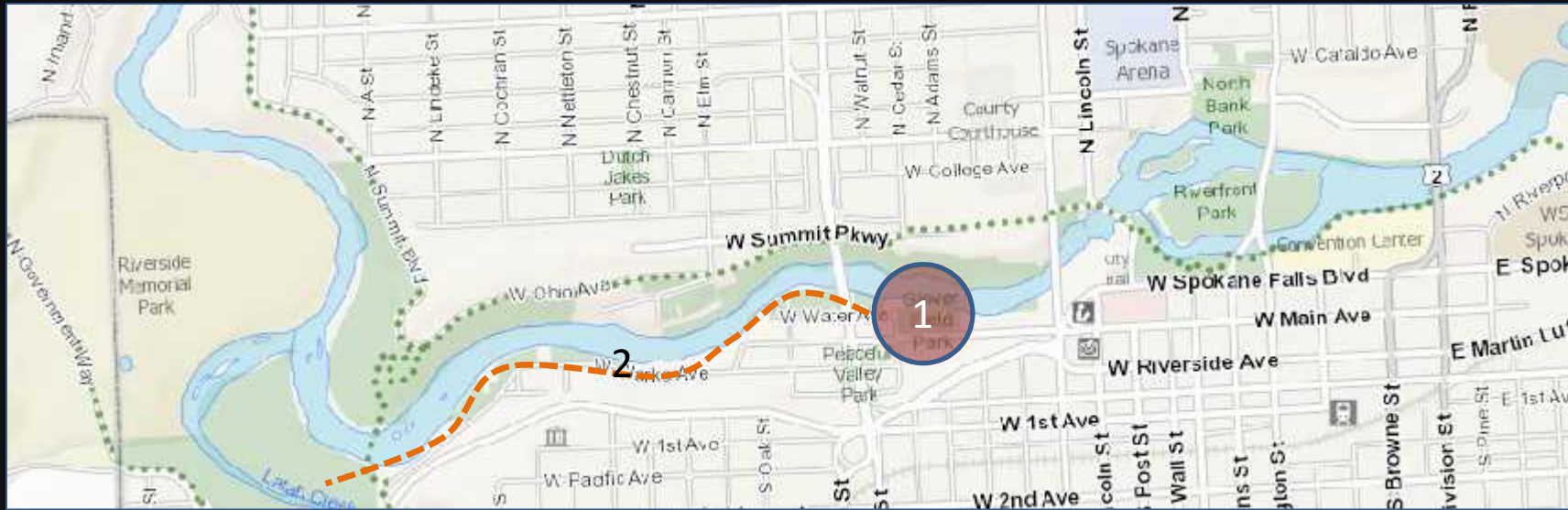


Public Access to Waterways

 - Approximately **8** miles of shoreline along Latah Creek
