What is Code Enforcement?

- Code Enforcement typically is an inspections-based approach to private property regulation and compliance with adopted standards.
- In addition to these efforts, the City of Spokane's approach includes a large team of litter control and abatement personnel.





Homeless Outreach Team

The Homeless Outreach Team (HOT) typically consists of:

- Spokane Police Officers
- Code Enforcement Litter Crew, and
- Outreach Partners (Revive/SNAP/Frontier)








Homeless Outreach Team - Purpose

 The HOT responds to complaints of camping activity daily.

 The team contacts individuals experiencing homelessness to offer services, mitigate public health and safety concerns, and maintain <u>public</u> spaces, including those directly adjacent to our waterways.







HOT cleanups in the last 12 months

- 1,847 completed cleanups
- Over 650,000 lbs. of garbage and debris removed


Partnership with Spokane Riverkeeper

- Much of this activity occurs directly adjacent to the Spokane River and Latah Creek.
- Geography complicates traditional cleanup efforts
- City of Spokane and the Spokane Riverkeeper have partnered on countless cleanups over the years.
- In 2024 alone, nearly 50,000 lbs. of garbage removed through this partnership.
