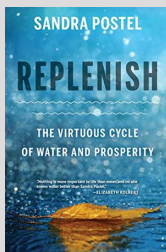


The Spokane River Forum is a non-partisan, non-profit organization that creates materials, events and activities that promote sustaining a healthy river system while meeting the needs of a growing population.

**Date:** Saturday, May 5th

**Map Description:** 20 volunteers needed to plant native riparian species along the shoreline to restore damage done over the years by unmanaged river access. Please bring a shovel (if you have one), work gloves, sturdy shoes, outdoor work cloths, and water bottle.

### Hangman Creek Willow Warrior Weekend

**Date:** Friday, April 27th and Saturday, April 28th
