Red Band Park water trail access and South Gorge trail to begin construction

Glover Field has been renamed Red Band Park, and now includes the riparian area between Water Avenue and the river. This summer construction will begin on a trailhead that will feature a non-motorized boat launch, vehicle turnaround, expanded parking, and restroom facility where the ballfield and former community center are located. The field itself was restored last year by the Spokane Indians ballclub and KXLY-TV's Extreme Team. **Read More**
