## Aubrey White Put-in and Take-out Improves Water Trail Access

The Spokane River Forum, City of Spokane, Spokane Indians Baseball Redband Campaign and Silver Bow Fly shop teamed up to improve Spokane River

access for anglers, paddlers and rafters at the Aubrey White Water Trail access point. This put -in and take-out is located adjacent to the City of Spokane Riverside Park Water Reclamation Facility.

This improvement project showcases the dramatic rise in the Spokane River becoming a destination recreation attraction for both residents and visitors alike. In 2010, the Spokane River Forum founded the Spokane River Water Trail ([www.spokanewatertrail.org](http://www.spokanewatertrail.org)) to connect the community to the Spokane River in ways that also promote stewardship and conservation values.
